The Department of Pathology and Molecular Medicine in the Queen's University Faculty of Health Sciences is recruiting a Term Adjunct appointment for the 2024-25 academic year to teach (100%) of a blended course entitled:

Clinical Biochemistry (PATH381)

Term: Fall 2024, September - December

Location: On campus

Course level: Third year

Format: Blended In-person and virtual lectures, student presentations and PBL teaching sessions

Enrolment Cap: 180

PATH 381 is a 3.0 Unit blended (virtual and in-person) course being offered in the 2024 Fall term. Enrolment cap is 180 students. PATH 381 is an upper-year health sciences course that covers topics relating to the integrated role of clinical biochemists within a healthcare team. PATH 381 covers advanced topics of biochemistry and analytical chemistry in relation to the practice of clinical biochemistry in healthcare. Students will critique how laboratory principles, biochemistry, and analytical techniques are applied to practical medical problems in the context of various diseases. Through problem-based learning (PBL) approaches, students will gain experience in identifying and troubleshooting issues in laboratory testing as well as the integrated role of clinical biochemists within a healthcare team. The successful candidate will have responsibility for coordinating this course, and have regular access to high speed internet and a computer that meets current specifications to present material effectively in-person or in a virtual environment, communicating regularly with students and providing timely and constructive feedback on assignments, inviting guest lectures as needed, being flexible in terms of availability and partnering with teaching assistant(s) in the delivery of the course.

Candidates must have a PhD and at least 2 years of knowledge and experience in, or relevant to, the field of instruction. Preference will be given to applicants who can provide evidence of strong and effective teaching experience in a university setting and current commitment to education. This Term Adjunct appointment is subject to funding and/or enrolment criteria. The appointment begins 1 September 2024 and ends 31 December 2024.

Deadline for electronic receipt of applications is noon on **Friday, May 31st, 2024**. Applications shall include a letter of interest, complete and current curriculum vitae (CV), any other materials the applicant wishes to submit (such as a teaching dossier, teaching philosophy, teaching assessments), and the names and contact information of two referees who may be contacted, and sent to:
